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At Ludlow Infant Academy we aim for our children to become valuable and fully rounded members of society who treat others with respect and tolerance, regardless of background. We promote the basic British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty, and mutual respect and tolerance for those with different faiths and beliefs.

British Value	How do we teach this?
Mutual Respect and the Tolerance of those with different Faiths and Beliefs	<p>Respect is a fundamental school value which is communicated to children through our classroom and school rules.</p> <p>We pay explicit attention to this as part of our RE, PHSE, and SMSC curriculum.</p>
Democracy	<p>Democracy is a school value that children meet when discussing respect and fairness:</p> <p>‘Class rules’.</p> <p>Children’s voice is valued throughout the school at class and whole school level.</p> <p>Whenever possible we model the democratic process informally.</p> <p>Children are given plenty of opportunities to share their views – across the curriculum.</p> <p>Children are also taught to respect public institutions and service as part of their learning.</p> <p>We have a school council which meets regularly. The aim of</p>

	<p>the meetings is to seek the children's views and opinions on a range of school issues. Sometimes the members of school council feedback to their class and sometimes they collect class views which they represent at the meeting. Every child on the school council is voted in by their class.</p>
Rule of Law	<p>All children are taught to understand the importance of making 'right choices'. Children are taught to understand that we need to make right choices to keep our school a 'happy and safe place to learn'.</p> <p>Our PSHE and SMSC curriculum provide staff with further opportunities to embed our 'values and rules.'</p> <p>We teach children the importance of keeping to the school rules.</p>
Individual Liberty	<p>Children are strongly encouraged to develop independence in learning and to think for themselves.</p> <p>We support the children in becoming confident, effective independent learners and citizens in many of our curriculum activities.</p> <p>We foster children taking responsibility for their own action e.g. their 'Choice.'</p> <p>We teach children that with freedom comes responsibilities for their behaviour.</p>

Mutual Respect.

Our ethos at Ludlow Infant Academy is one of mutual respect and adults actively model respect with one another and with children. We teach children the meaning of respect and what this looks like in practice. We teach children to show respect for one another as well as themselves and what this means in terms of how we speak and act towards each other. Children take pride in their work and their school.
