

Ludlow Infant Academy Sports Premium Report

September 2016 to August 2017

Over the past two years, we have focused much of our Sport Premium funding on improving the curriculum. We have continued to develop our curriculum, REAL PE, based around the development of children's fundamental movement skills. We have introduced a new Gymnastics scheme which the teachers have trialled and will be having further training in next year. We have also increased the competitive opportunities for children, with half termly intra-school competition and taken teams out to racket skills and football competitions against other schools.

At Ludlow Infant the funding is being used to deliver the following projects and initiatives:

- To work with Solent Sports Partnership to provide high quality CPD for staff, extra-curricular activities and a range of competitions.
- To promote fitness and active play in order to improve fundamental movement skills, health and well-being and positive behaviours.
- To develop competitive skills and performance for all children, as well as providing pathways towards excellence.

Over the course of the year the Head Teacher, PE Leader and Governors will monitor the impact of the funding on the above aims. The funding decisions are based on the Ofsted Report 'Beyond 2012 – outstanding physical education for all'.

Current Plans for 2016-2017 include:

1. Continue to develop staff training with our REAL Gymnastics scheme and provide refresher training in REAL PE. For the PE leader to undertake training in REAL Dance and implement this across the school on a trial basis.
2. Develop the school grounds, including playground markings and training and resourcing for lunch time play activities.
3. Use the Create Development CD wheel to ensure effective monitoring of progress within the new PE curriculum.
4. Further increase opportunities for Intra and inter school competitions, including taking part in more competitions against other schools.

Review of 2015-2016

Amount of Sport Premium Funding: £8900

PE and Sport Premium money is spent with great care and consideration at Ludlow Infant Academy. We achieved the AFPE (Association for Physical Education) Quality mark with Distinction in December 2015. We have implemented Family funs and Real Gymnastics.

During the year, children have taken part in high quality PE lessons and taken part in several different competitions. We have even started taking children to compete against other schools, at Racket skills and football festivals. There has been support for new staff with REAL PE teaching and all staff with the implementation of a new Gymnastics scheme.

Staff and pupil surveys carried out by Sport Solent show we have come a long way since 2013, such as confidence with assessment and gymnastics/dance teaching. 100% of staff felt that the quality of schemes of work were either excellent or good and 100% felt that children's activity levels were either excellent or good during PE lessons.

Enhanced support package from Solent Sports Partnership	£4,450	100% of pupils in all year groups took part in termly competitions. Staff received REAL PE training. 78% of staff were at least very confident in the delivery of REAL PE. 100% of staff felt the quality of the schemes available for delivery of PE, including gymnastics was good or very good. Lessons observed by the school sports partnership were all graded good or outstanding, leading to high level outcomes for children.
Family Funs Programme	£900	17 families in Year 1 took part in the Family FUNS programme. All families increased physical activity levels at home and used the resources and training to support their children's fundamental movement skills, as well as their personal and social skills. 100% of families said that the course was well delivered and that they had become more confident with helping their children at home with PE.
PE Equipment	£1000	All areas of the curriculum were fully accessible due to high quality equipment being made available. 78% of staff identified the quality of equipment available to be good.
Transportation to and from venues for competitions.	£600	35% of year 2 pupils took part in direct inter-school competitions, through racket skills and football festivals. This allowed all children involved to develop their understanding of competition and fair play. Children with the potential for excellence were able to develop this in a competitive format.

Staff CPD (led by PE Leader)	£2500	<p>62.5% of staff said the support given to them by the PE Leader was excellent.</p> <p>A new, high quality gymnastics scheme was introduced. All staff had lessons modelled and were supported with planning and assessment of the new scheme. Children's gymnastic skills have developed as a result of this.</p> <p>All staff had CPD linked to differentiation in REAL PE. 56% of staff are now very confident/confident that their lessons are differentiated during PE, compared to 12.5% in 2013.</p>
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
